Riyaa is the opposite of Ikhlas - What is Ikhlas?

الرياء فمشتق من الرؤية وهو أن يعمل العمل ليراه الناس

To be seen by the people

السمعة مشتقة من السمع وهو: أن يعمل العمل ليسمعه الناس

To be heard by the people

It's foundation is doing actions of goodness and piety so that people see them or hear of them, in order to win their praise and admiration, to gain position and status amongst them and to obtain the goals and objectives of this world.

يَّأَيُّهَا ٱلَّذِينَ ءَامَنُوا ۚ لَا تُبْطِلُوا صَدَقَاتِكُم بِٱلْنَّ وَٱلْأَذَىٰ كَٱلَّذِى يُنفِقُ مَالَهُ ولِلَّآءَ النَّاسِ وَلَا يُؤْمِنُ بِٱللهِ وَٱلْيَوْمِ ٱلْنَاخِرِ

O you who have believed, do not invalidate your charities with reminders [of it] or injury as does one who spends his wealth [only] to be seen by the people and does not believe in Allāh and the Last Day.

The Prophet, sallallahu 'alayhi wa sallam, said:

"What I fear for you the most is the **Minor Shirk, that is ar-riya**. Allah will say on the Day of Judgement when He is rewarding the people for their actions: Go to those for whom you did Riya for in the world then see if you find the reward with them."

"Shall I not inform you of what I fear for you more than the Masih ad-Dajjal? It is the **hidden Shirk**. It is when a man stands up for prayer, then beautifies his prayer for another to look at."

Refuting the people of knowledge
Seeking knowledge to acquire fame

The Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) taught to his companions: "Shirk among you will be more subtle than the footsteps of an ant, but I will teach you something which, if you do it, both minor and major shirk will be kept away from you. Say:

O Allah, I seek refuge in You lest I associate anything with You knowingly, and I seek Your forgiveness for what I know not.
